With a history dating back to the 1860's, the town of Cortland has its roots in rural America. And a calendar of events that includes a Fall Parade, a community pork chop dinner, and an apple bake-off demonstrates that the old-fashioned pleasures of country living are still enjoyed here, and throughout much of the surrounding area.

Lying just north of Cortland, Sycamore is perhaps the picture-perfect example of classic small-town American living. In Sycamore, the parking meters still take pennies, the tiny Old Popcorn Stand has been turning out treats since the late 1800s, and storekeepers still call their customers by name. From the grand Victorian-style mansions of its historic district to the busy stores and restaurants on its charming State Street, Sycamore turns back the clock to a time of calliopes and Sunday concerts. Don't, however, mistake Sycamore for a museum. This vibrant town also has great new shopping districts, 200 acres of parkland, an 18-hole golf course, a modern hospital, churches for 16 denominations, annual festivals, an industrial park and much more.

Just west of Cortland is the thriving city of DeKalb, home of Northern Illinois University, where 25,000 students pursue degrees in 54 majors and 74 graduate programs. This prestigious institution is an active neighbor, providing a host of benefits to the community, from athletic events and concerts to summer camps and arts programs for area children. The university also contributes a dynamic atmosphere, bringing restaurants, nightlife, movie theaters and unique shops that local residents enjoy along with the students.

DeKalb Public Schools are ready to welcome students from Richland Trails. Cortland Elementary is located just minutes from the community, while older students benefit from the expanded academic, athletic and extra-curricular opportunities offered by Huntley Middle School and DeKalb High School.

A variety of sports and outdoor activities are available in the area, from nature hikes at scenic parks and forest preserves to golf at nearby courses. DeKalb's Hopkins Park Aquatic Center offers a welcome refuge on hot summer days, with a wading pool for toddlers, two waterslides, a diving well with high board and a spray pool.

Along with country comforts and small town pleasures, Cortland offers all the conveniences of suburban living. Shoppers find a selection of grocery stores and national retailers along Route 23, a short drive from the community. Easy access to I-88 makes for a quick trip to Westfield Fox Valley Center, Aurora Premium Outlets and the restaurants and shops of downtown Naperville.
